

PUBLISHING RULES

1. *Finisterra-Revista Portuguesa de Geografia* [*Finisterra-Portuguese Journal of Geography*] is open to scientific collaboration aimed at the dissemination of the results of scientific research within the ambit of Geography and its neighbouring fields.
2. *Finisterra* publishes articles, notes and reviews in Portuguese, French, English and Spanish.
3. The authors bear full responsibility for the opinions and concepts included in their contributions.
4. The submitted originals shall be refereed by two specialists in the field. The final decision as to their publication rests with the Editorial Board and shall be taken based on the reviews by the two referees. Acceptance of a text for publication presupposes that it has not been previously published, that it is not being submitted to other journals for publication at the same time and that it cannot be fully or partially reproduced without the authorisation of the Editorial Board of *Finisterra*.
5. The authors are responsible for obtaining the authorisation to use any material subject to copyright.
6. Rules for submitting original texts.
 - 6.1. The texts to be submitted for publication must be sent in digital format (*Word*) to **rev.finisterra.ceg@fl.ul.pt** as well as on paper (one printed copy) to Revista Finisterra, Centro de Estudos Geográficos, Faculdade de Letras, Cidade Universitária, 1600-214 Lisboa. The text should be formatted in *Times New Roman* font, size 12, 1.5 line spacing and 2.5 cm margins. The name of the file should consist of the author's surname or that of its first author (e.g. **silva.doc**).
 - 6.2. The articles must not exceed 20 pages A₄, including bibliography, figures and tables. The notes and bibliographic reviews must not exceed 12 and 3 pages A₄, respectively.
 - 6.3 All articles and notes must be accompanied by their respective abstracts (around 700 characters), which should provide an overview of the main contents: a) abstract in Portuguese; b) abstract in English; c) should the article be written in a language other than Portuguese and English, an abstract in that language should also be included. The keywords and the translated versions of the title should also be indicated in all the languages of the abstracts.
 - 6.4. The tables should be included in the same *word* document as the text and should be numbered in roman numerals. The figures (maps, charts, photographs, etc.) should be numbered in arabic numerals and **should not be included in the same file as the text**. Each figure should be sent separately (e.g. **silva_fig1.jpg**) in one of the following acceptable formats: *jpeg, tiff, bmp, cdr, wmf*. The resolution should be equal to or greater than 300 dpi. The figures should be easily legible, considering the printed area of the *Finisterra* journal (19 x 12cm). The authors are urged to comply with the basic rules of cartographical representation and, whenever possible, graphic conventions should be used instead of grey scales. Colour figures can be included in the text, but the costs of their publication should be borne by the authors. All the tables and figures should be referred to in the text. Their titles should be short, expressive and accompanied by their translation into English.
 - 6.5 The authors' mailing addresses and *e-mail* addresses should be indicated in the original text as a footnote to the first page.

7. Rules for bibliographic references.

7.1. The bibliography should include all the references indicated in the text, and only those. All the bibliographic references should comply with the following formatting models:

7.2. The bibliographic references throughout the text should consist of the author's surname followed by the year of publishing (e.g. Gripp, 1994). Should there be two different authors, their surnames should be separated by "and" (e.g. Benn and Evans, 1998). Should there be more than two authors, only the first author's surname should be indicated, followed by "et al".

7.3. The footnotes should **not** include any bibliographic references.
