Preconditions of a return policy

- a) Clarity about the organization and objective of the national policy
- b) Defining the core terms ("Return", "Safety", "Dignity", etc.)
- c) Willingness to take account of the returnee's personal situation
- d) Willingness to integrate returnees in the country of origin





Elements of the concept of return in safety and dignity and with prospects for the future

- a) Common Working Principles:
 - → To work demand-orientated and in the interest of the returnee
 - → To accept the free decision of the returnee to return
 - → To empower the returnee
 - → To offer confidentiality





- b) Instruments to support an individual return process:
 - → Individual counselling on prospects
 - → Individual counselling on return
 - → Individual preparation of the return and reintegration
 - → Individual support of the return and reintegration



Conclusions

- a) A successful return policy is characterized by the inclusion of developmental, economical, sociopolitical and humanitarian factors
- b) A successful return policy accepts the fact that mankind's mobility is growing in scale and extend, that it is getting more complex and shows regarding its root-causes and impacts many regional and sub-regional differences.





- c) The indicator of a successful return policy is the sustainability of the return and reintegration.
- d) The instrument for a successful return policy is the implementation of the concept of return in safety and dignity and with prospects for the future.
