



(excluding emergency reception)



## 2. Reception Structure

- ▶ Fedasil organizes 15.875 reception places (excluded emergency centers).
  - ▶ Federal centers: 3.824
  - ▶ Red Cross centers: 3.513
  - ▶ NGO: 1.397
  - ▶ Local Reception initiatives: 7.141

# 6. Legal situation in the reception network (August 2006)

Residents in asylum procedure	25,0%
Positive decision asylum procedure	4,7%
Illegal stay, higher appeal gives right on reception	48,6%
Illegal stay but tolerated	8,4%
Illegal (5 days to leave the country)	6,0%
Other situations (non accompanied minor, etc.)	7,4%
