A high proportion of migrants in irregular condition

- A chronic, structural feature
- Despite frequent opportunities for regularization
- Extraordinary regularizations in 1986,1991, 1996, 2000-2001 and 2005
- Plus mechanisms for lagalization on individual bases

The 'irregularity equation'

- A vigorous demand for foreign labor, mostly unskilled or semi-skilled
- A narrow 'front door'
- A large underground economy
- Acute difficulties for controlling flows

Inability to control entries

- Location and physical characteristics
- High rates of circulation (a strong tourist industry)
- Visa exemptions and easy access to tourist visas
- Loopholes in 'Schengenland'

The inability to control stays

- A large informal sector
- The weakness of labour inspection
- A lax, permissive legal and civic culture
- Difficulties to expel
